

SAGB Canterbury Conference University of Kent, Canterbury 21-27 August 2022

"India: History, Current Developments and Culture"

We return to the attractive University of Kent for our conference this year. The theme is India, reviewing political, social, historical and cultural themes, both in India itself and also the diaspora.

India is an ancient and culturally rich civilization. Britain established a presence there in the early 1600s, enforcing direct rule in 1858. The period until Independence in 1947 was turbulent and today, after a period of relative stability, many observers are concerned with the rise, over the past decade, of Hindu nationalism with its powerful leader, Narendra Modi. Britain has a large Asian diaspora community, around 8% of the population, including London's Mayor, Sadiq Khan. For the arts in the UK, particularly dance, the influence of India has been considerable. We plan to have lectures and discussions on all these aspects.

The conference features four days of lectures, discussion and group work, with translation in English and German. Also included is a one day excursion to Rye: "...medieval streets clustered around a sandstone hillside, overlooking the River Rother – a historic and picturesque East Sussex town." Canterbury itself is a beautiful city with a magnificent cathedral, a Roman museum and fascinating streets.

Free car parking is available at the University and we will again have the use of the luxurious senior common room for evening socials.

We advise those interested to apply for a place a soon as possible, **but to wait to book transport until the end of June.** Travel route suggestions will be sent at the end of June.
